Great Canadian Beer Festival is Coming to Cranbrook BC on September 23!



THE EI RESULTS

The combined spending of out-of-town participants, staff, spectators and other people who visited Cranbrook for the Kootenay Rockies Gran Fondo, in combination with the expenditures made by the event organizers, totalled \$435,452, supporting just under \$618,000 in overall economic activity in British Columbia, including almost \$531,000 of economic activity in the Cranbrook area.

These expenditures supported over \$180,000 in wages and salaries in the province through the support of 4.3 jobs, of which 3.8 jobs and over \$147,000 in wages and salaries were supported locally.

The total net economic activity (GDP) generated by the 2023 Koolenoy Rockies Gran Fondo was:

- \$375,433 for Canada as a whole
- \$298,362 for the province of British Columbia
- \$231,119 for the city of Cranbrock

The 2023 Koolenay Rockies Gran Fondo supported tax revenues totaling \$138,558 across Canada.


MOUNTAINS, LAKES AND RIVERS, WILDLIFE, THE CLIMATE AND SEASONS, AND REGIONAL AND PROVINCIAL PARKS ARE THE MOST IMPORTANT ATTRIBUTES

The natural environment dominates the key drivers of place in Cranbrook. A distinctive nuance is that mountains and lakes and rivers are the most important factors, followed by climate and seasons, wildlife, as well as, regional and provincial parks.

College of the Rockies, and Canadian Rockies
International Airport (XYC) also score high, a key
indicator of the importance of the infrastructure
Cranbrook has as the regional hub.

One value stood out from all the rest:

Community & Relationships. Residents not only hold an unwavering regard for family but also place an immense premium on social connections. Although it's intriguing that only half of the residents feel

Cranbrook currently possesses strong community ties, this underscores the collective aspiration to elevate interpersonal bonds and fortify community connections.

Amidst this shared commitment to fostering a tight-knit community, there lies a golden opportunity to shape Cranbrook into a haven of mutual support and connection. However, a critical observation emerged through further engagement – the absence of a community gathering place or square where residents from diverse backgrounds and interests can converge and interact. Rectifying this void could be the catalyst needed to transform Cranbrook into a vibrant locale, where individuals not only coexist but thrive in a shared sense of NK connection and support.

CRANBROOK IS SO MUCH MORE THAN...

"Its <u>exterior appearance</u> (old buildings that should be demolished and junky look of some places), the interior (heart) of Cranbrook is full of beauty and excitement."

"The strip and some of the ugly or dull streets. It has diversity of hidden treasures, including: people, businesses, sports, recreation, natural areas of wonder, and arts opportunities."

"Dirty, unattractive downtown core."

"What is looks like on the outside, our first impression here was ugly town, but there's a lot to do within 15 minutes / half an hour."

"A place to drive through on your way somewhere else."

"A shopping and service centre"

"An industrial town, it is a city of diverse people who work hard and strive to live happy lives with their families. We come for the work and stay for the living.

"Just a highway town."

"A <u>small town</u>, it is beauty in every direction, it is helping your neighbours and watching out for each other."

"Mountains and hockey."

"The East Kootenay <u>hub.</u> It is forever growing and improving with restaurants, events, culture and so much more."

"A conservatively minded little town."

"Just a place to work, it has diverse programs and facilities for all members of your family and many ways to enjoy the great outdoors."

IN WHAT WAYS DO YOU THINK THE CITY IS CHANGING?

"I think Cranbrook is changing for the better by incorporating more community events that aim to bring us together. A lot more young people are coming to our community for experiences."

"Diversity! Different cultures and people means different types of <u>businesses</u> (bubble tea hut for example), more cultures, more acceptance and awareness that our differences make us special."

"More concerts, festivals, music in the park, the farmers market, etc. More celebrations and <u>events</u> bringing people together as a community."

"We have seen a <u>revitalization</u> of our downtown over the last years that is incredible and a huge improvement." "For the better with more trees planted throughout town and better restaurants (The Heid Out, Fire Hall, Encore, Allegra) and for the worse with the <u>homeless</u> people and <u>crime rate</u>."

"It is become more culturally diverse but it is much less affordable than before."

"I wish Cranbrook was changing faster. We seem to be considering a lot of change and asking about needs but I have not experienced anything tangible."

"It isn't (changing). Residents here are not open to change and innovation."

"Changing from industrial to tourism."

"The increasing crime rate has ruined the safety and quietness Cranbrook used to have. Cranbrook is losing touch with what the younger people want within their community, the city is too much of a retirement community, catering to seniors."

"For the worse, it's <u>run down</u> with little being done to improve the city for young families, tourists, and newcomers."

"Getting way <u>busier</u>, <u>traffic</u> has increased so much over the last four years."

"Too many <u>big city folks</u> with ideas for a small rural community."

"Small businesses are struggling with crime and petty theft."

"I came here for the outdoors, it's more affordable than other Kootenay towns."

"Cranbrook has the six best fly-fishing rivers in North America."

"There is no fine dining in Cranbrook, there is no population base for it, one person tried and couldn't make it work."

"Key City Theatre is a great kind of cultural venue."

"I have never been somewhere that has this caliber of mountain biking, gravel biking and road cycling."

"Want to see Cranbrook grow and expand tourism opportunities but not too fast."

"I'm concerned about the readiness of both guests and those delivering the information about sensitive topics related to Indigenous experiences."

"We're balanced in Cranbrook, we're not dominated by one culture or identity."

"It's a cultural experience going to a Bucks game."

"We're more conservative than Nelson. We have family values and are down-to-earth."

"There are transportation challenges, some of our airlines pulled out, and buses are missing links between Kimberley, the airport, areas with recreation and to any attractions like Fort Steele."




