
YoY Improvement

FISHING

Spectacular fishing experiences live here, Bold? Maybe, True? VERY.

Dur rivers and streams are ideal for fly fishing & drift boats, while the long-deep lakes are perfect for triolling and spin casting.

The Cranbrook region offers some of the best trout fly fishing in Canada. In the summars, laives and streams can be found stocked in abundance thanks to the Kootenay Trout Hatchery. In the winter, the lakes are cotted with tents as fishermen take to the frezen waters while fish are hangry and without access to food.

Crarbrook and the surrounding areas fall under the Frevinces Pegion 4 Keetanay Regional Regulations. Each lake and river have differing allowances for fifting of each species, beit use, and catch and release regulations. We secourage you to check the regulations before embarking on your trip.

Regional restrictions prevent river fishing between April 1 to June 14, but anylors hard to the lakes between April and June, when fly fishing is excellent. The only river garrapt from this restriction is the Kooteney River. Fishing bere is popular on weakends all year long.

→ River fly fishing for rainbow and cutthroat trout, Whitefish and Bull Trout from July to October is sopuler in the Columbia River, Toby Craek, Bull River, Kootaney River, Skookumchack River, St. Many's River, and Finday Craek.






Creatorook has three main areas for shedding. The first, and the most paradar is humberton which is 25-minute drive from Creatorook.
